



BROADWAY COMES TO OLMV



Godspell is a musical by Stephen Schwartz which opened Off Broadway in May, 1971 and has been on tour with various theatrical companies around the world. One of its songs, **Day By Day**, reached # 13 on the Billboard pop single chart in the summer of 1972. The structure of the musical is a series of parables, mostly based on the Gospel of Matthew. The parables are interspaced with a variety of songs set to modern music and often based on traditional hymns. The Passion of Christ is treated briefly at the end of the production. A film version was released in 1973.

OLMV Parish is pleased to offer a production of **Godspell** on Friday, July 18 and Saturday, July 19 at 7:00pm each evening. The show will be held in the Church Hall which is air-conditioned. This show will be an adaptation by the "Outset" Players" led by Anthony Tumolo, a local thespian.

There will be no charge for the show, but the parish is accepting a free will offering which will be used to help defray the cost of upgrading the Church air-conditioning system.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Whoever eats this bread will live forever." These words of Jesus Christ remind us that he is, indeed the "Living Bread." Jesus reminds us that he is of God the Father and that as we share in his life-giving Word, we become true followers, eligible to share eternal life.

Today we celebrate the great Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. We recall Jesus' words to his disciples, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven...Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you."

We know that Jesus chose the Passover feast as the time in which he would institute the Eucharist. In doing this, Jesus gave the Passover feast a new definition and meaning. Jesus, himself, becomes the High Priest of the **NEW** Covenant. Jesus offers himself as the perfect sacrifice to the Father, and he changes the bread and wine into his Body and Blood which becomes the offering for salvation for all people. Jesus shared his Body and Blood with those who were with him at the "Last Supper;" and when he said "Do this in memory of me," Jesus was commanding his followers to repeat his actions and words until the "Second Coming."

Since the very beginning of who we are as Church, followers of Jesus have repeated Jesus' words and actions as they celebrated "Eucharistic Liturgy." From the earliest days of the Church, followers of Jesus met together and shared God's Holy Word and followed this by a shared meal in which Christ became present by the power of the Holy Spirit in the "Breaking of the Bread."

As Catholic believers, we understand that at Mass Jesus' presence is real and enduring. Our true "Mystery of Faith" is that Jesus becomes wholly and truly present in Holy Eucharist. Since the Middle Ages, a special word has been used to express the changed of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. This word is "transubstantiation." What we try to express when we use this word is that the "substance" of bread and wine is changed into the "substance" of the Body and Blood of Christ. This change is "The Real Presence" of Christ. What still looks like a wafer of bread and a cup of wine is now really and truly the Body and Blood of Christ. And this "Real Presence" endures even after Mass is completed. This is why we reserve the Eucharist in a golden receptacle in the Tabernacle. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus becomes present during the "words of institution" at Mass and that Jesus remains present under the "form" of bread and wine.

While it is a custom that is no longer observed as it should be, in the Roman Catholic Church, parishioners are asked to genuflect before entering a pew. We do this because we recognize that the "Real Presence" of Jesus is reserved in the Tabernacle behind the altar.
