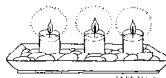

A letter from our Pastor

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“He was amazed by their lack of faith.” Can you imagine the huge disappointment that it must have been for Jesus to be invited to preach in the local synagogue in his home town after he had accomplished so much in the surrounding towns and villages, only to be rebuffed by the local townspeople who refused to believe that he could possibly carry the authority of God within? The townspeople “took offence at him” because of who he was and where he came from.

Isn't it true that so often people make decisions based on emotions and heresy rather than reason and logic? The other day I was appalled to see a short video in which a college professor asked a panel of celebrities why they thought the United States was the greatest of nations. One person cited our “freedom.” Another celebrity noted that Americans have a “great work-ethic;” still another noted the “diversity and opportunity” that exists in our country. Everyone on the panel noted something positive about our country in response to the professor's question until the last person on the panel. He said: “I don't think that the United States of America is a great nation at all!” He pointed to a number of areas where our nation falls short with respect to others: mathematics and science education, racism, life expectancy, infant mortality, health care, incarcerated persons per 1,000 and median income.

We just celebrated Independence Day in our country. We celebrate this day as a national holiday---filled with parades and pomp---because we value the idea that was promulgated with the Declaration of Independence and further developed with our Constitution and Bill of Rights. Are we a perfect country? We are all aware that there are many areas in which we as a nation must address as we continue to serve as a beacon of hope for the many persons who still flood our borders each year. The United States has been and continues to be a nation where so many hope to begin new lives---living in safety and enjoying freedoms that we too often take for granted.

The USCCB has just completed what has become an annual “Fortnight for Freedom.” This year's theme was the “freedom to bear witness.” The First Amendment, among other rights, prohibits the government from making laws which will “impede the free exercise of religion.” In inviting parishioners to participate in the Fortnight for Freedom, the bishops remind us that the right to bear witness to our faith is something that is to be treasured always. From the time of our baptism, we are charged to proclaim our faith in word and action, and we must be prepared to challenge attempts to curtail our freedom to exercise our religion, that is, our Catholic faith.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we are privileged to share a powerful faith---a gift given by Christ himself. We are also privileged to exercise this faith in a truly great country. We must be vigilant in living and expressing our faith so that Jesus never says of us that he is “amazed by our lack of faith!” We must be equally vigilant, also, in the exercise of our Constitutional rights. If we are not willing to work to ensure that our rights are protected, it becomes both easy and expedient for others to erode what we carelessly take for granted.

We have now entered into that wonderful time between Independence Day and Labor Day. May you find rest and relaxation from work and pressures of life! May you also remain faithful and make time to worship the Lord!

Join the Diocese of Metuchen delegation for this historic first visit of Pope Francis to the United States

The Diocese of Metuchen invites you to participate in a pilgrimage to Philadelphia for the Mass to be celebrated there by Pope Francis on September 27, 2015.

The Holy Father announced last November that he will come to Philadelphia for the eighth World Meeting of Families being held there. He will celebrate a public Mass with a million or more participants on Sunday, September 27 on the steps of the Philadelphia Museum of Art, in full view of the crowds arrayed from the museum down the Ben Franklin Parkway. No tickets are required for the Mass. No general seating will be available. The Mass is a standing event.

The Diocese has made arrangements for bus transportation from various locations throughout the diocese. A number of parishes/groups are also running bus trips to the Papal Mass. The Papal Mass is tentatively scheduled for 4 pm. The exact schedule is not yet available from the event planners in Philadelphia, but we anticipate very early departure times. Once we have a clear picture of the number of people who want to participate from each site, we will assign bus coordinators and send confirmation materials with precise details. Prayer and reflection resources will also be provided to enable pilgrims to share a common experience as the Diocesan Church in preparation for and on the day of this special event.

The round trip bus reservation and pilgrimage package will be approximately \$55. per person. Each participant is responsible for their own meal costs on that day and also any train/shuttle expenses from the parking lot to the event site and back. Pilgrims should be physically fit and prepared to walk several miles. Reservations for bus seats are limited and will be accepted on a “first-come first-served” basis. For those interested in reserving a bus seat, you may do so starting on **July 8, 2015** using the preferred online method by visiting: www.diometuchen.org/WMOF. You may also register via phone by calling 732-562-1990 ext. 1543 during the hours of 10am -1 pm, Monday thru Friday starting on **July 8, 2015**.

PARISH REGISTRATION:

In order to be considered a parishioner, all adults (persons 21 years of age or older) must complete a registration form which can be picked up at the parish office. Often, young adults who grew up in the parish don't realize that they must be registered on their own. Please remind young adults (family and friends) that they must register with the parish. Many young adults presume that they are registered because their parents are members of the parish. Once a person has reached adulthood, he or she must register in person to be considered a member of the parish. **To be eligible to receive sacraments or to receive sponsor letters, persons must be registered and active members of OLMV.**

Godparent and Sponsorship letters:

Only registered and active parishioners can receive letters to serve as a godparent for the Sacrament of Baptism or to serve as a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Very often a person who is not registered at OLMV will request a sponsorship letter, explaining that he/she graduated from the school, made sacraments at OLMV or that parents still attend our parish. It is important for young adults to realize that it is their responsibility to register at the parish of their residence.

La Diócesis de Metuchen le invita a participar en una peregrinación a Philadelphia para la Misa que el Papa Francisco celebrará el 27 de septiembre, 2015.

El Santo Padre anunció en noviembre del año pasado que vendría a Philadelphia para el 8° Encuentro Mundial de las Familias. Celebrará una Misa con un millón y más participantes el domingo, 27 de septiembre, en la escalinata del Museo de Arte de Philadelphia, a la vista de una multitud que se extenderá desde el museo a lo largo el Parkway Benjamin Franklin. No se requiere ticket para la Misa. No hay disposición de asientos. La Misa es un evento en que los participantes estarán parados.

La Diócesis ha organizado el transporte por bus desde varios lugares en la Diócesis. Unas parroquias y grupos también han organizado viajes a la Misa Papal. El horario tentativo de la Misa Papal es a las 4:00 p.m. Los organizadores del evento en Philadelphia todavía no han publicado el horario definitivo. Sin embargo, el horario de salida será muy temprano. Cuando tengamos una idea clara de cuántas personas quieren participar de cada lugar, nombraremos los coordinadores de buses, y enviaremos materiales con más detalles. Recursos para oración y reflexión se proveerán para ayudar a todos los peregrinos a tener una experiencia común como Iglesia Diocesana en preparación para ese día y para ese día mismo.

El precio por persona para el viaje ida y vuelta y el paquete de la peregrinación será de \$55.00. Cada participante es responsable por los costos de su comida y del transporte de enlace entre el estacionamiento de los buses hasta el lugar del evento, y la vuelta.
