## A letter from our Pastor

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is something sad about endings. Last Monday, we began our liturgical ordinary time in 2016, and we looked forward to a year full of hope and faith as we considered how we would be impacted by the Church's **Jubilee of Mercy**. At the same time, we experienced real sadness as we removed the beautiful poinsettias and wreaths from the church, took down the trees that so beautifully represented the "Light of Christ" and carefully put away the indoor and outdoor crèche scenes.

There is always something special about the celebration of Christmas--especially within our parish setting! And every year there is a real "let-down" as we begin to take down and put away our decorations and all those special signs of Christmas. We continue think about the Christ-child, the shepherds, the wise men, the "host of angels" and that powerful scene in the Temple as Simeon and Anna recognize that the Messiah is present to them in the special child! This "Christmas" experience has invigorated our faith and, hopefully, has strengthened us as we continue now to live our faith in ordinary ways.

**Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy  
The Holy Door**



The Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy proclaimed by Pope Francis began on December 8, 2015, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, when the pope opened the Holy Door at St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome.

The Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy began in the Diocese of Metuchen on December 20 when Bishop Bootkoski opened the Holy Door at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi. An article in the Catholic Spirit by Editor-in-chief, Joanne Ward, described the event and the significance of the door as follows:

“Before opening the Holy Door at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi on December 20, Bishop Paul G. Bootkoski stood at the Baptismal font where prayers were said, and a Gospel passage as well as a section from the Bull of Indiction of the Extraordinary Jubilee were read. The bishop then processed into the vestibule of the Cathedral and pulled open the Holy Door—the inner right door that had been shut December 13, and putting his hand over his heart, crossed the threshold signaling the beginning of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in the Diocese of Metuchen.”

“Since the 15<sup>th</sup> century, Holy Doors have been used as a ritual expression of conversion during jubilee years. Today, passage through the Holy Door still signifies the passage from sin to grace which every Christian is called to accomplish. Jesus said, “I am the door” (John 10:7), in order to make it clear that no one can come to the Father except through him.” Further discussing the door, the caption on the picture on the front page says: “By fulfilling certain conditions, pilgrims who go through the Holy Door can receive a plenary indulgence.”

May we use this Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy to shape our lives to be “Merciful like the Father.”

En *Misericordiae Vultus*, la Bula de Indicción (o Proclamación) de el Jubileo de la Misericordia, El papa Francisco dijo: Jesucristo es el rostro de la misericordia del Padre. El misterio de la fe cristiana parece encontrar su síntesis en esta palabra. Ella se ha vuelto viva, visible y ha alcanzado su culmen en Jesús de Nazaret. En la « plenitud del tiempo » (*Gal 4,4*), cuando todo estaba dispuesto según su plan de salvación, Él envió a su Hijo nacido de la Virgen María para revelarnos de manera definitiva su amor. Quien lo ve a Él ve al Padre (cfr *Jn 14,9*). Jesús de Nazaret con su palabra, con sus gestos y con toda su persona revela la misericordia de Dios.
