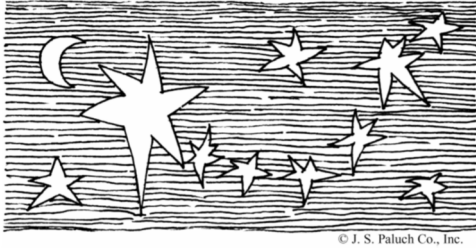

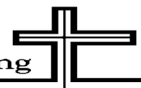

### **CROCHETTIERS AND KNITTERS**

For those of you who are new, The Project Linus, we are a national non-profit organization and we offer comfort and security to children going through a crisis through the gift of handmade blankets. ## **A NOTE FROM FATHER PAT My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

Jesus continues his ministry. Even though we can presume that Jesus has come to Peter's home for a chance to relax and rest, he readily responds to the needs of others. He cures the sick and he casts out demons from those who are presented to him. He then goes off to pray. And we are reminded early in Mark's Gospel of the importance of prayer to Jesus. He must regularly renew himself with the Father so that he can continue his ministry to the people to whom he has been sent.

Peter realizes that Jesus has gone off somewhere so he looks for him. When he finds Jesus, he tries to get him to go back to his home and continue to minister to the crowd that has gathered. At first we are surprised that Jesus not only doesn't return to Peter's house and continue his ministry to those who have come to meet him; rather, he insists that now it is time to go to other towns and villages so he can preach to them. As Jesus tells Peter, "For this purpose have I come."

Indeed, Jesus is aware of his purpose, that is, to share the Good News of the Kingdom of God with the People of Israel. Today as we meditate on our Gospel passage we, hopefully, become aware of a powerful intensity as we encounter Jesus. We are still meditating on the first chapter of Mark's Gospel and we have already been present with Jesus as he comes forward to be baptized by John in the desert, as he enters into his desert (temptation) experience and as he calls his disciples. We have been with Jesus as he shares God's word in the synagogue at Capernaum, we have witnessed, in awe, the casting out of a demon. Finally we spend time with Jesus as he "rests" at Peter's home, as he cures many and also casts out demons. We now are with him as he tells Peter that they must move forward so that he can do that which is his mission: to preach the Good News. Jesus goes forth to surrounding synagogues and preaches the word and casts out demons!

I think that we who are among the 21<sup>st</sup> century followers of the Lord are invited today to consider the intensity with which Jesus shared the Good News of the Kingdom of God with the people of Capernaum and the surrounding communities. More than this, I think we are invited today to consider "our purpose" as 21<sup>st</sup> century followers of Christ.

Today, all too often, we seem to lack both the awe and the intensity with which we should encounter and then share Christ. Perhaps what is most telling in this first chapter of Mark's Gospel is the great desire of people, once they have encountered Jesus, to remain with him. Peter tries to get Jesus to go back to his house because "everyone is waiting for you." They have been awed by his presence and want to continue to be with him.

Shouldn't it be the same with us? We encounter Jesus at Mass and we even come forward to share in Eucharist. Yet so often, once we leave the church, the incredible encounter we have just experienced with the Lord easily fades into the background. We continue our day and week, often not even remembering that together we have heard the Word of the Lord and been nourished by the Lord in Holy Communion. Like the believers at Peter's house, we must be waiting for the Lord--always!!!
