## A NOTE FROM FATHER PAT My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue to celebrate the Easter season, enlivened by the presence of the risen Christ in our lives and, in a most powerful way, sharing the “Peace” of Christ. In last week’s Gospel passage from the Gospel of John, Jesus appears to the apostles in the locked room and shares with them His “Peace.” Today’s Gospel passage is from the Gospel of Luke. In this passage, Jesus also appears to the apostles and again offers His “Peace.”

The Gospel writers were very clear in proclaiming that Jesus did rise from the dead and was present among them. For them the presence of Jesus was everything---and the “Peace” imparted to them by Jesus was of the greatest importance. Even today, isn’t the peace of the Lord so central to our relationship with Jesus that we include it within our sacred liturgy: “May the Peace of the Lord be with you always,” and “Let us offer each other the sign of peace.”

In today’s Gospel, the followers of the Lord are filled with awe and also with terror at the appearance of the Lord in their midst. Certainly, at first, they think they are seeing a ghost. Jesus assures them that it is really him---he is no mirage! He points out his wounds and he asks them for something to eat. And we all know that ghosts don’t need food!

I think that it is important for us to be aware that Jesus spent time with his disciples in fellowship before he entered into dialogue with them. What must they have been thinking? “Is this really Jesus? Is it possible that he really did rise from the dead? What can it mean for me? For us?”

All too often the second part of today’s passage is just glossed over. “He opened up their minds to understand the Scriptures.” Jesus assured them that they were “witnesses to these things.” And, indeed, they were witnesses to the beginning of “all things new,” that is the new age of salvation because of the truth of Jesus Christ present in their midst.

Today, my brothers and sisters, we are also asked to be awed and even a little terrified because Jesus is really and truly present in our midst. Today, two thousand years after Jesus shared his peace and his wisdom with his apostles, so he shares his peace and wisdom with us.

We come together to be nourished in Word and in Holy Eucharist. What takes place as we celebrate Jesus present among us at Mass is really not so different from what those first apostles experienced. We are enlivened by the “Peace” of Christ as we come together to be enriched by his very presence and to become immersed in the Holy Scriptures as we listen to the Sacred Word proclaimed and explained.

Today we are invited to share in the true presence of the risen Lord, to accept and share his true and abiding “Peace” and to witness the truth of God’s Holy Word. Like those first apostles, we are called to be witnesses to the truth of Jesus Christ, risen from the dead and alive and present among us!
