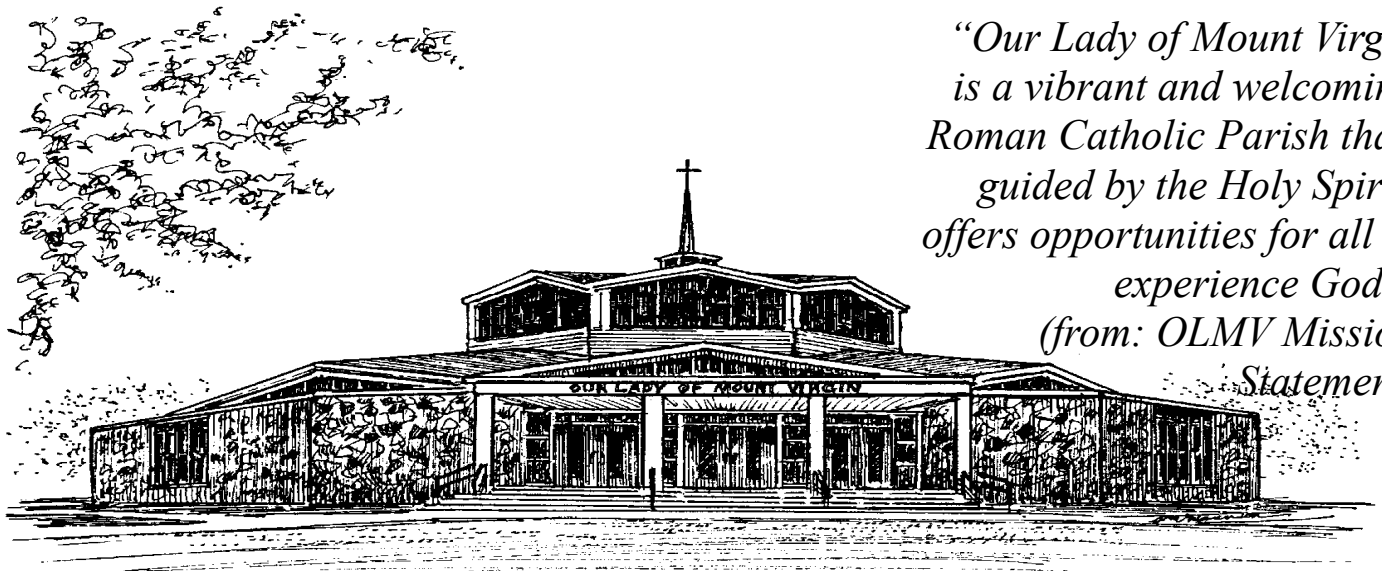

### **My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

Jesus came among the disciples and spoke to them in their midst: “Peace be with you.” Like the disciples, we have passed through the time of the Passion and we are now celebrating the time of the Resurrection of Jesus. Jesus has, indeed, risen and is now present among his disciples---and by extension---us! And we should be filled with awe as we consider the Great Easter Event!

Today Jesus makes himself known to his special disciples who are hidden away in the upper room. Even though the entrance way is locked, Jesus appears in their midst and shares his special peace: “Peace be with you!” John tells us that Jesus shares his greeting of “Peace” a second time with the apostles. How powerful is Jesus’ “Peace” as it is shared with the apostles and as it is shared with us! We should be truly awed by the truth of the risen Christ in our lives as we continue to celebrate the Resurrection.

We consider today’s Gospel passage and are invited to really enter into the profound peace of the risen Lord: Jesus has risen and no longer is confined to the limitations of humanity; Jesus appears among the apostles; He is powerfully changed, and yet he is still the same!

There are, and continue to be, those who doubt his resurrection. The disciples are sent forth after receiving the Spirit from the risen Lord and they are commissioned to forgive sins. As we listen to today’s Gospel passage, we are reminded that Jesus also sends us out into our world to share the Good News of his resurrection from the dead. John is very clear that this gospel passage is for all the generations so that we may come to know and believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and that we will “have life in his name.”

Like the disciples, we have participated in the trials of the Lord and now we experience with them the great joy of Jesus’ Resurrection. Like the apostles in the upper room, we are invited today to enter with Jesus into new life.

We have all shared in a powerful faith experience---Passion, Death and Resurrection! And this experience has strengthened our hearts and minds and souls, helping us to become more solidly connected to Jesus.

Now, we must endeavor diligently to keep our hearts and minds open to the presence of the Lord in our everyday lives. Together, as members of this worshipping community, we are invited, even compelled, to share the Lord’s “Peace” with everyone we meet.

The Lord once shared his “Peace” with the apostles in the locked upper room, and he shares his “Peace” with us today. We must be open always to the Lord’s “Peace” and by our words and actions; we must be willing to go forth and be the Peace of Christ to the world! May the Lord’s “Peace be with you!”
