My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The month of May has always been powerful for us as Catholic believers as we continue our spiritual journey. Just as we witness daily the "rebirth" that takes place in nature, so we also see the life-giving presence of the risen Lord in the life of the church. May is one of traditional months for weddings, and it is truly inspiring to see beautiful brides and elegant grooms as they begin their married lives together with hope, faith and love. This time of year is truly a time of sacraments: so many babies entering into the faith through Baptism after the long Lenten period of preparation, adults entering the faith and completing their initiation sacraments through the RCIA process, young adults stepping forward to "receive the Holy Spirit" during the sacrament of Confirmation, and finally, so many of our young children who come to the altar for the first time to receive First Holy Communion.

There can be no doubt that in an age when faith is both attacked and questioned, that the presence of the risen Lord is here at Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish, and that we are a powerful and vibrant community of believers who make a difference in the world.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us that he is the vine and we are the branches. Without the life-giving connection to Jesus who is the vine, we, the branches, cannot hope to be effective in promulgating the powerful message that Jesus is our Savior and Messiah and that he is present among us now and always.

As Catholic believers, we claim a direct connection to Jesus, a direct connection to the very foundation of our Church when the Spirit came to the Apostles at Pentecost. In the two millennia since the very foundation of who we are as church, much has transpired that has helped to form who we are today. In slightly more than two thousand years, the church has developed an incredible catechism---a set of beliefs and code for living in the presence of the Lord. As a believing and worshipping people, we try to live by a creed of faith statements which are supported by a code of morality and grace-filled actions which we call Sacraments. Finally, we have a prayer life that includes prescribed as well as spontaneous communication which opens our hearts to God.

We, you and I, are branches that must always be connected to and nourished by the vine if we are to be effective in communicating the presence of the risen Lord in our community. Each of us must be committed to our creedal beliefs, we must endeavor each day to follow God's commands to us, we must actively partake in our sacramental life and, finally, we must spend time in prayer with our Lord.

Let us, together, become "fruit-filled" branches, and may our fruit nourish our community---opening the hearts of many to the presence of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
