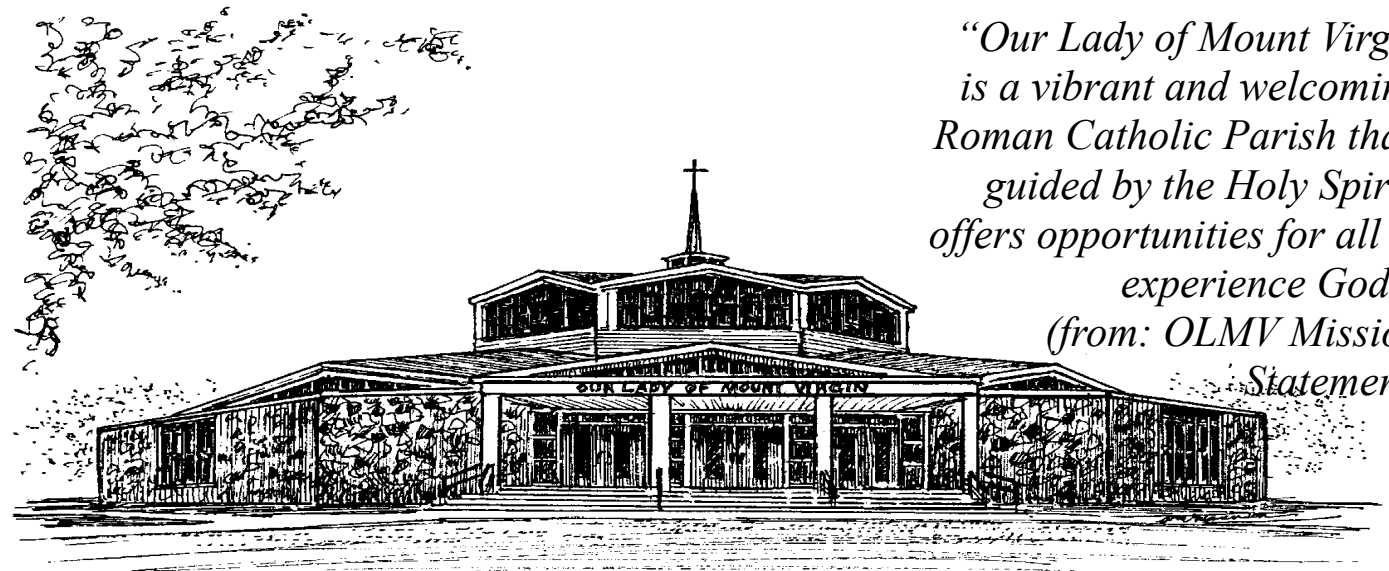

### Godparent and Sponsorship letters:

Only registered parishioners can receive letters to serve as a godparent for the Sacrament of Baptism or to serve as a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Very often a person who is not registered at OLMV will request a sponsorship letter, explaining that he/she graduated from the school, made sacraments at OLMV or that parents still attend our parish. It is important for young adults to realize that it is their responsibility to register at the parish of their residence.

### **My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

We continue to bask in the glory of the Risen Lord today, and we spend time considering one of the most beautiful of all the Gospel passages. We read and then meditate on the encounter between Jesus and two of his disciples who are travelling from Jerusalem to their homes in Emmaus.

This passage is found at the end of the Gospel of Luke and is a wonderful exploration of how Jesus' disciples slowly came to understand His presence in their lives after the Resurrection.

There are two men who are returning home after their hopes had been dashed when Jesus is arrested and crucified. They are dejected, bitterly disappointed, and they appear to be actually running away from Jerusalem. They are afraid that they too might soon experience pain and death at the hands of the Jewish leadership or the Roman authorities.

At first they do not recognize Jesus when he joins them on their journey. It is only at Jesus' prodding that they begin to tell this fellow traveler what has transpired in Jerusalem. They are even incredulous that this traveler seems to know nothing about the events of the past few days. The traveler continues to engage them in conversation and slowly begins to teach them about the scriptures. When it becomes late, they beg the traveler whom they still do not recognize to stay with them. They ask him to join them for dinner so they can continue their conversation.

It is only when the traveler takes the bread, blesses it and breaks it that they finally recognize the risen Christ who has been in their midst all along.

It is often so easy for us it is often so easy to lose sight of Jesus and not to recognize his presence in our midst. Actually, become lost. We become so absorbed in our own lives that we no longer recognize Jesus' presence in our daily lives. We become overwhelmed by the pressures of daily living, and we forget the most precious aspect of our lives: we **are truly** alive only in and with the risen Christ!

Jesus Christ is, indeed, with us---today and always. Like the disciples on the Road to Emmaus, we must recognize our Lord in the "breaking of the bread." Even more, we must recognize the presence of Jesus in our everyday lives---in our worship, in our words and in our actions! And, even more, we need to recognize the risen Jesus in our encounters with our brothers and sisters, right here, and throughout the world.
