





Parish Membership:

Any new families who have recently moved into our parish are invited to register as parishioners at OLMV. In addition, adult children 18 years of age or older (or upon completion of college) must also register separately to be considered participating parishioners. **A participating parishioner is registered, attends Mass regularly, contributes to the support of the church and participates in the life and ministries of our parish.** It is never too late to register as a parishioner.

Godparent and Sponsorship letters:

Only registered parishioners can receive letters to serve as a godparent for the Sacrament of Baptism or to serve as a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Very often a person who is not registered at OLMV will request a sponsorship letter, explaining that he/she graduated from the school, made sacraments at OLMV or that parents still attend our parish. It is important for young adults to realize that it is their responsibility to register at the parish of their residence.


