My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Spring is certainly a season of Sacraments. Here at OLMV, young adults step forward each year to be "confirmed" in their faith. The "Yes" of these young people is a loud and clear confirmation that our Catholic faith is a living entity---our faith is lived and shared from generation to generation. Our young parishioners take their place as fully initiated Catholics who take their place with the wider church, living and sharing the presence of Christ in the community.

Each year, OLMV is so proud of the youngsters who come to the "table of the Lord" to receive their First Holy communion. They have had the opportunity to speak to the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation as they asked forgiveness for their sins. Our parish community looks on them with such pride as they receive the Lord in Holy Communion, announcing to us by their action, that our faith is alive and vibrant here in our community.

Along with the children, we always have adult members of our community who enter into the life of our faith through baptism; and we have others who complete their initiation into the church as they receive Holy Communion and Confirmation.

It is a grace for us as church to witness the baptism of babies as well as the number of marriages that take place here at OLMV each spring.

Last week in this space, I wrote a little about the beauty of Marriage as a Sacrament of our faith. I would like to share a few thought now about another powerful sacrament that usually takes place in the spring each year: ordination to the priesthood and permanent diaconate.

This year Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish is particularly honored as we anticipate the Ordination of Thomas Sommero to the Permanent Diaconate. Tom will be ordained on June 6, 2015 by Bishop Bootkoski and will serve the People of God here at Our Lady of Mount Virgin Parish. A number of men will be ordained to the Permanent Diaconate with Tom. In addition, three men will be ordained as Transitional Deacons and will continue their formation in the coming year. Two men will also accept Bishop Paul's call and will be ordained to the holy priesthood.

While all the baptized share in the "common priesthood," only bishops, priests and deacons share in the ordained priesthood. Bishops receive the fullness of the Sacrament of Holy Orders and are usually called to govern a "particular Church." Priests share in the "ministerial Priesthood" and exercise their pastoral functions as prudent co-workers with their bishop. While deacons do not share in the "ministerial Priesthood," their ordination confers upon them important functions in the ministry of the word, in the ministry of liturgical worship and, primarily, in the service of charity.

In a few weeks, I'll celebrate the thirteenth anniversary of my ordination to the Holy Priesthood. To live and to exercise the ministry of a priest has been both a great blessing and a constant grace during these years. I am grateful to Bishop Bootkoski for ordaining me and also for appointing me to serve you as pastor of our parish community. I am stilled awed by the power of God's grace as I am privileged to proclaim the presence of Christ in Word and in Sacrament.

I pray all for who are discerning God's call to the priesthood or the diaconate: be not afraid to say "Yes!"


