

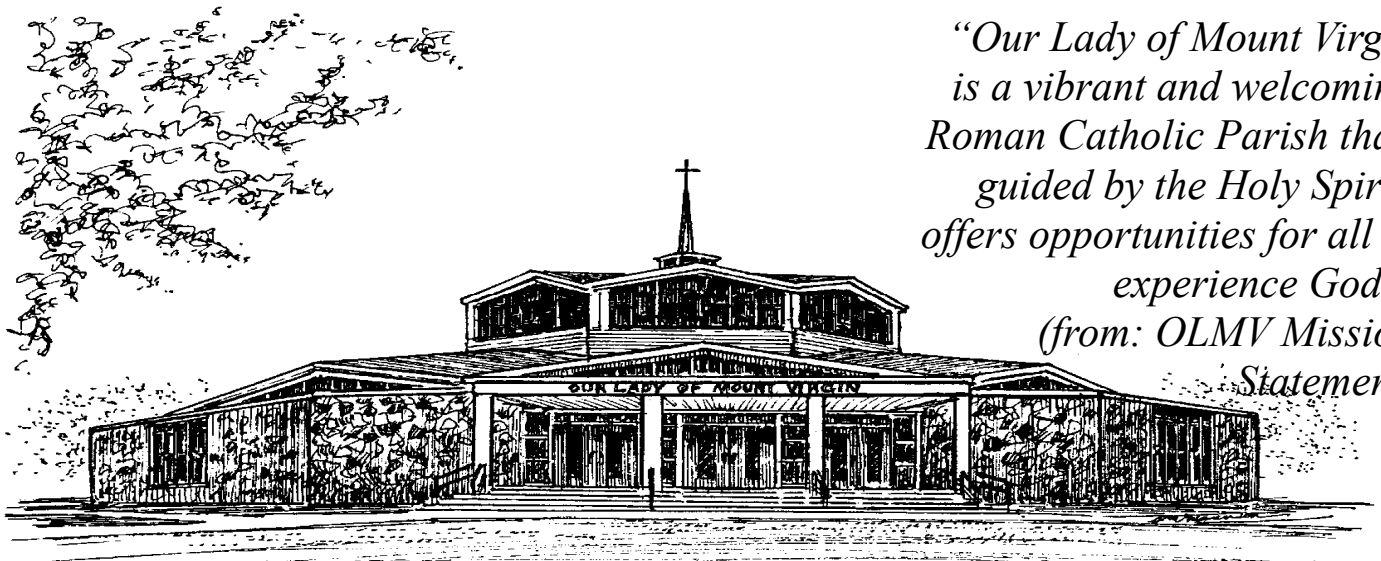

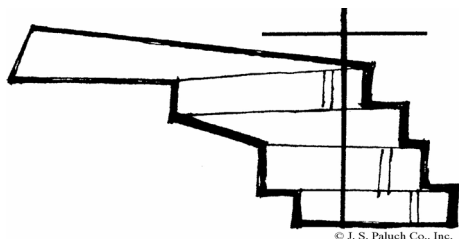



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During the weeks of the Easter season, the Church spends time reflecting on the **Acts of the Apostles**: Saint Luke's account of the life and early development of the early Church. In today's first reading, we witness an infant "church." The Apostles must find new ways to minister to all the members of this new "church."

The "Hellenists" were members of this new church who were not from the "House of Israel." They complained that the needs of their widows were not being addressed properly, that too much emphasis was placed on the needs of the members whose roots were Jewish. The leadership met and discerned together, deciding how to best meet the needs of an expanding and "emerging" church that included Jews and non-Jews alike.

The Apostles recognized that they had a primary obligation to "proclaim the Word of God." They invited the membership to discern seven "reputable men" from among the believers--men filled with the spirit of God--who could assist the Apostles in ministry. The seven men were chosen, and the Apostles "laid hands on them."

With the assistance of the Holy Spirit, the leadership of the Church discerned **the need for deacons**--men chosen from among the membership who would assist the Apostles in carrying out the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Over the centuries, our Church has discerned the need for men and women of faith and goodness to come forward--as did those first deacons. Even today the Church needs men and women to assist with the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Think of those individuals who have come forth to meet special needs in the church--who have responded so powerfully to God's "call." We think of persons such as Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Dominic, Saint Elizabeth Seton, Mother Theresa of Calcutta; and we think about our two newest saints: Saint John Paul II and Saint John XXIII-- just a few saints of our Church who had the courage to follow Christ and spread the Gospel to God's people.

Almost two thousand years after the call of the first Deacons, we, as a Church community are still invited to explore God's call--God's invitation to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are invited to ask: "How is God calling me?"

Here at OLMV we are so fortunate to have two Deacons who are celebrating 20 years of service to God as ministers of our Church. We congratulate Deacon John Tietjen and Deacon John Czekaj as they continue to serve the Lord here at our parish. We look forward to the day, not too far away, when Tom Sommero will be ordained as a permanent deacon for our own community of faith. Who else is "out there" discerning God's call to service? We must all proclaim the Gospel of Jesus the Lord!
