

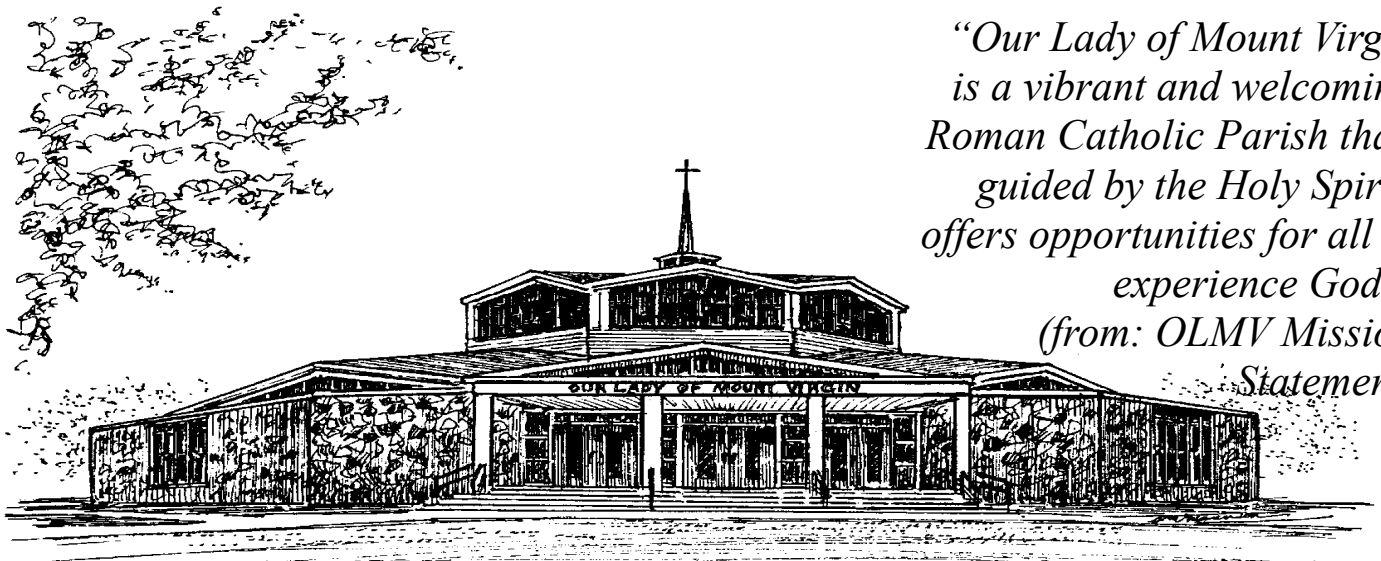

Sunday, May 25 at 7:00 P.M.

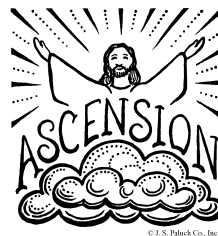

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It seems that spring has finally arrived and that summer is right around the corner. Hopefully after a particularly difficult winter and the slow return of spring-like weather, we will be more attuned to God's goodness to us as we enjoy the beauty of spring flowers, trees and plants. Spring is traditionally a time of sacramental life for us as members of the church. Just as life is renewed in nature each spring, so are we renewed as a parish community as many of our parishioners grow in the sacramental life. After a long Lenten absence, baptisms become a part of our worship cycle with both adults coming forth at the Easter Vigil and babies presented for baptism on Sunday afternoons.

Almost fifty of our second grade children received First Holy Communion on the first Saturday of May, and many of the adult members of our community also continued their initiation in the church as they received Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil or at the monthly Mass celebrated by our Chinese Community.

Just a week ago, more than fifty of our young adults proclaimed their faith here in our church as they spoke a resounding "Yes" to God, and stepped forward to receive the "Gift of the Holy Spirit." During the Easter season we also had a number of adults who entered into the fullness of initiation to our faith community as they, too, received the Holy Spirit. We will proudly accept an additional four members of our adult community into the fullness of our faith when they come forth on Pentecost Sunday to be confirmed in the faith!

April and May seem to be particularly popular months for weddings, and at OLMV we are so proud of the many young couples who enter into the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony here in our church, particularly in the spring and early summer. To be part of the beautiful nuptial celebration and witness a bride and groom exchange their vows before God is such a privilege. It is a grace to support a young couple as they begin the lives together as a man and wife.

My brothers and sisters, sometimes in the hustle and bustle of daily life, we forget that our beautiful church is more than a building where we come together to celebrate Mass on the weekend. Our Lady of Mount Church is more than a physical structure; it is a place made holy because of the graced actions that take place here. Indeed, Jesus is present among us each week at Mass when we come together to worship and be nourished in Holy Eucharist. Our church is truly a holy place. It is filled with the grace of God and alive with the presence of the risen Lord.

Have no doubt: God's grace is present and active here at OLMV! God continually bestows his grace on us at Mass and in the Sacraments---and we are better for it!

Godspell is a musical by Stephen Schwartz which opened Off Broadway in May, 1971 and has been on tour with various theatrical companies around the world. One of its songs, **Day By Day**,

reached # 13 on the Billboard pop single chart in the summer of 1972. The structure of the musical is a series of parables, mostly based on the Gospel of Matthew. The parables are interspaced with a variety of songs set to modern music and often based on traditional hymns. The Passion of Christ is treated briefly at the end of the production. A film version was released in 1973.
