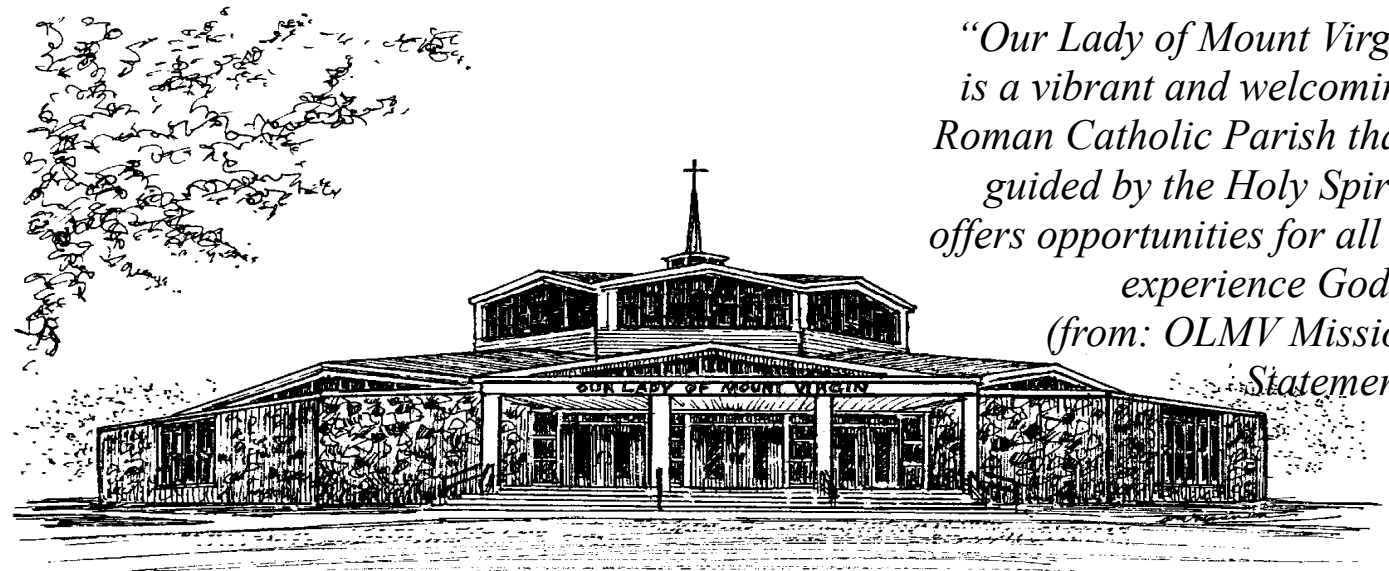

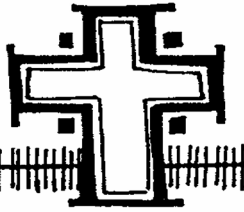

Godspell is a musical by Stephen Schwartz which opened Off Broadway in May, 1971 and has been on tour with various theatrical companies around the world. One of its songs, **Day By Day**, reached # 13 on the Billboard pop single chart in the summer of 1972. The structure of the musical is a series of parables, mostly based on the Gospel of Matthew. The parables are interspersed with a variety of songs set to modern music and often based on traditional hymns. The Passion of Christ is treated briefly at the end of the production. A film version was released in 1973.

OLMV Parish is pleased to offer a production of **Godspell** on Friday, July 18 and Saturday, July 19 at 7:00pm each evening. The show will be held in the Church Hall which is air-conditioned. This show will be an adaptation by the "Outset Players" led by Anthony Tumolo, a local thespian.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's first reading from the Book of Exodus, the Lord makes his presence known to Moses who prays that he will find favor with the Lord and then invites the Lord: "Do come along in our company. This is indeed a stiff-necked people; yet pardon our wickedness and sins, and receive us as your own." We look further to today's Gospel passage and begin to comprehend the depth of God's love for us now that we are his own: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son."

Today we celebrate the wondrous "Solemnity" of the Most Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is that powerful mystery in which we become aware that our God is "One." Our God is "One" who is present to us as three distinct persons: "Father, Son and Holy Spirit." This is a magnificent and incredible mystery; and we can only begin to "scratch the surface" of mystery as we consider the creative love of the Father, the redeeming love of the Son and the sustaining love of the Holy Spirit in our everyday lives. We as Catholic persons have a beautiful way in which we recognize the Holy Trinity. We make the "Sign of the Cross" during our time of prayer and during our time of worship. When we make the sign of the cross, we are announcing that God is one---a unity which is also a communion of three persons, what we might call a "family of love!"

In the Gospel of John we read that "God is love." This is a clear and firm declaration by the Apostle John that "love" names the very essence of God. In his book, Catholicism, Rev. Robert Barron points out that the Apostle was not suggesting that God **has** love or that love is a **mere attribute** of God. It is clear that John means that "God must be, in his own life, an interplay of lover (the Father), beloved (the Son), and shared love (the Holy Spirit)."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church points out that "the mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. (# 261) The Old Testament shows God as one, unique, without equal. "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone." (DT 6:4) It is God who created the world, who made a covenant with his people and who is Father to the poor, the orphan and the widow. Jesus, in the New Testament, revealed God as Father in a new sense. God is Father in his relationship with Jesus, who is the "only begotten Son." The Son is divine, as is the Father; and the Son promises to send the "Spirit" who will serve as teacher, guide and consoler.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is a most powerful doctrine of our Church and leads us to three profound truths: The Trinity is One. We speak of three persons, each fully God in a magnificent unity of love. The three persons are distinct from each other; three identifiable persons, fully God, but distinct from each other. The Divine Persons are always in relation to each other. The Father cannot be Father without the Son, nor can the Son be Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is in constant relationship with the Father and Son who both send him Forth.
