BROADWAY COMES TO OLMV



Godspell is a musical by Stephen Schwartz which opened Off Broadway in May, 1971 and has been on tour with various theatrical companies around the world. One of its songs, **Day By Day**, reached # 13 on the Billboard pop single chart in the summer of 1972. The structure of the musical is a series of parables, mostly based on the Gospel of Matthew. The parables are interspersed with a variety of songs set to modern music and often based on traditional hymns. The Passion of Christ is treated briefly at the end of the production. A film version was released in 1973.

OLMV Parish is pleased to offer a production of **Godspell** on Friday, July 18 and Saturday, July 19 at 7:00pm each evening. The show will be held in the Church Hall which is air-conditioned. This show will be an adaptation by the "Outset" Players" led by Anthony Tumolo, a local thespian.

There will be no charge for the show, but the parish is accepting a free will offering which will be used to help defray the cost of upgrading the Church air-conditioning system.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Shortly after I was first appointed to lead our parish, I was invited to take a pilgrimage to Rome and the Vatican City with four other priests from the Diocese of Metuchen. The main purpose of our visit was to present two monstrances to Pope Benedict XVI for his personal blessing. These monstrances were then used at parishes around our diocese during holy hours where the faithful could pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. A highlight of that pilgrimage was the opportunity to attend Holy Mass at Saint Peter's Basilica on the Feast of Saint Peter and Paul and to witness Pope Benedict present the pallium to each new archbishop who had been appointed during the previous year.

The pallium is a woolen vestment that is worn by the Pope and by Metropolitan Archbishops as a sign of their Church Office. Each year specially selected lambs are blessed and presented to the papal household on the Feast of Saint Agnes. The wool of these lambs is used to make the pallium presented to each Metropolitan Archbishop by the Pope on the Feast of Saint Peter and Paul. The pallium is a special vestment that signifies the high office held by the Pope and the unique relationship that exists between Metropolitan Archbishops and the Pope. A Metropolitan Archbishop is not permitted to wear the pallium until it has been personally presented to him by the Pope on the Feast of Saint Peter and Paul.

While at breakfast one morning, I was fortunate to sit with Archbishop Richard Smith who had recently been appointed Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Edmonton in Canada. He invited me to sit with his parents at the Mass. It was certainly a very moving experience to share with his parents that moment when he received the pallium from the hands of Pope Benedict XVI. Two years ago, I met Archbishop Smith again when we both attended a conference on Stewardship and the Catholic Church. It was nice to reminisce about a beautiful time at Saint Peter's Basilica with one of the really solid leaders of our church.

As we celebrate the powerful Feast of Saint Peter and Paul today, I bring up a pilgrimage, a year of "prayer for vocations" in our diocese and a conference because each of them serves as a reminder of who we are as church and how our lives as Catholic people intersect, supporting each other and supporting our faith. As Catholic believers, we do not stand alone. We are part of the "Body of Christ" and we participate, by our lives, by our prayer and by our worship, in a living faith that can be traced back to the time of Christ himself and to the great Apostles, Peter and Paul. We are reminded today as we consider Saint Peter and Saint Paul of the many bishops who have served as leaders of our church throughout the world for two thousand years.

As did Saint Peter and Paul, our bishops serve by their leadership of the church. Today we are reminded that our bishops have been entrusted with a mandate that was given directly by Jesus Christ to Saint Peter and also to Saint Paul and to the other Apostles. Isn't it Peter to whom Jesus said "You are the rock." "Feed my sheep." "Follow me." Isn't it Paul who proudly claims shortly before his death: "I have kept the faith?" Isn't it Paul who proudly claims that his Gospel is the Gospel revealed to him by Christ, himself?

Let us have the courage to follow our bishops, and in doing so, follow Christ!
