

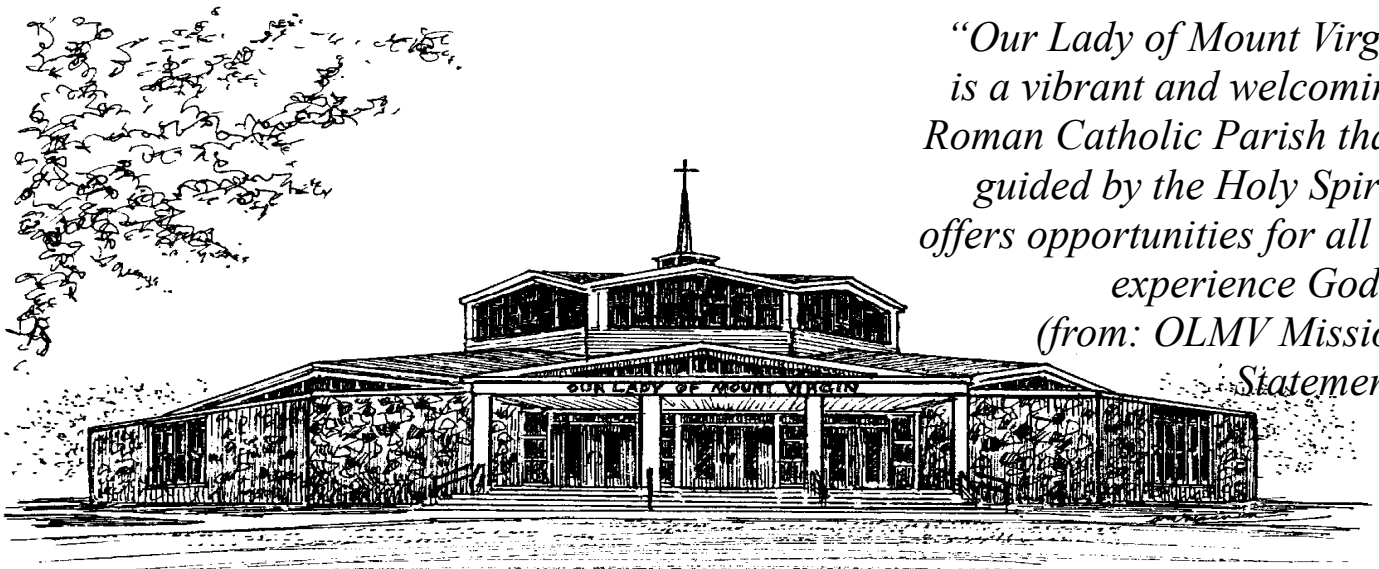

### My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we consider still more parables as we read and reflect on our Gospel passage. Jesus compares the kingdom of heaven to a buried treasure, a pearl of great price and a net filled with fish. We begin to realize that Jesus uses parables, long and short to help his followers to more fully comprehend the incredible gift that is the kingdom of heaven. Jesus expresses the "great joy" experienced by the person who finds the treasure. With this discovery, his life will be forever transformed--it is the same with the merchant. Don't both of these characters go off and "sell all their possessions" so that they can obtain their priceless treasures. Jesus makes it clear that the "kingdom of heaven" is a priceless treasure and that his listeners need to be ready to give up all their earthly cares--all those attractions that hold them back--if they are ever to possess this kingdom. And make no mistake, Jesus assures his listeners, the kingdom of heaven is worth it! Jesus, as we read today's Gospel, is sharing the same message to us.

My brothers and sisters, as we consider the parables of the recent Sundays and the parables of this Sunday, we are invited to consider our lives in respect to our desire to share in the kingdom of heaven. Jesus is reminding us that to participate in the kingdom of heaven, we must be willing to take great risk. We must be willing to give over ourselves completely, and without reservation, to life in the Lord. We must be willing to freely commit ourselves to living and sharing the truth of Jesus Christ present among us.

What this means is that we must be committed to putting our faith before our earthly cares. We must be willing to trust in God our heavenly Father and to depend on his never ending love for us. We must be willing to risk ourselves for the sake of the kingdom--for the sake of the risen Lord--and to share our faith with the world.

We live in an age in which we seem to be judged more and more by what we have--even more than by what we have accomplished. Isn't this why a "rap" artist "rapping" to a simple beat can make millions of dollars while celebrating violence or the degradation of women?

We who claim Jesus as our Lord and Savior, we who worship regularly as Catholic Christians, are invited today by Jesus to consider how we have reacted so far to the incredible treasure, to the "perfect" pearl that is the kingdom of heaven. Jesus suggests to us today, just as he suggested to his followers two thousand years ago, that we must be ready to "sell all we have" so that we might purchase the treasure he has before us. That treasure is life with him!

Are we, you and I, really ready to give ourselves over completely in utter trust to our Lord, Jesus Christ? It is such an easy question to ask. But isn't it really such a hard question to answer. Today, Jesus is inviting us to enter into life with him--to be totally committed to him because it is in and through him that we enter the kingdom of heaven. Are we ready?
