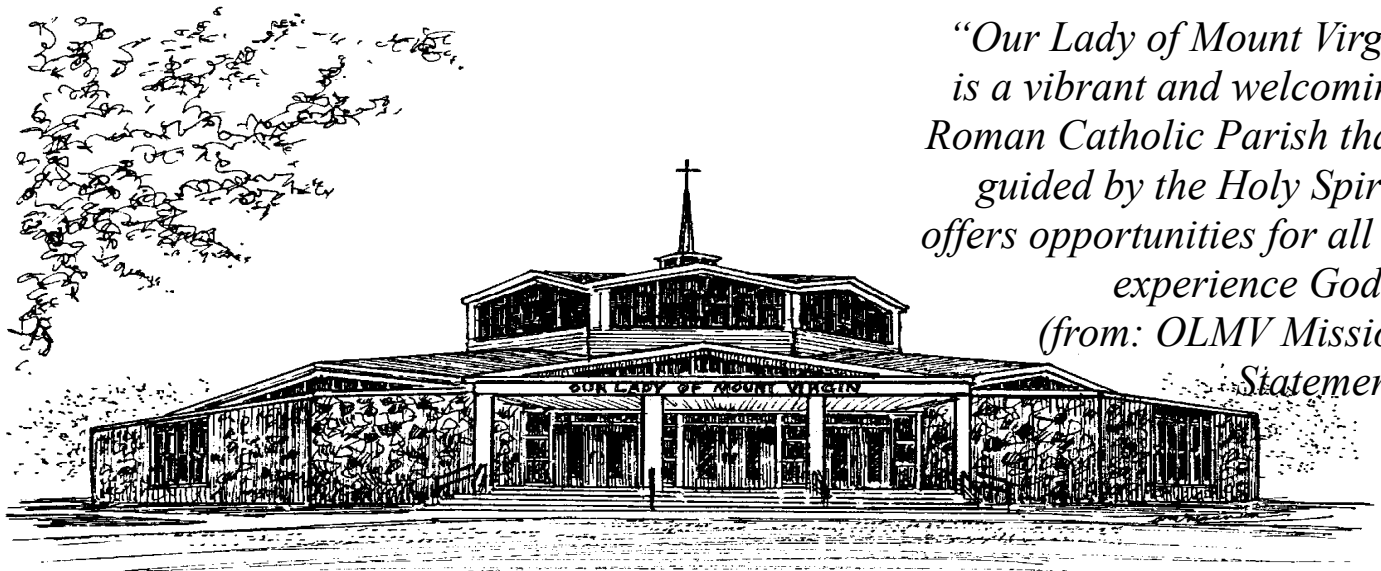

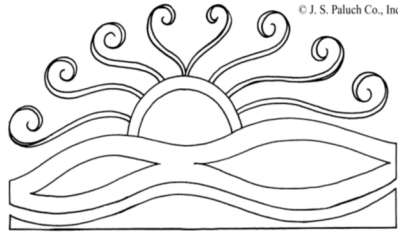

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Any standard definition of "Freedom of Religion" would suppose that it is a "fundamental right" of citizens to practice a form of belief without any fear of persecution by the state or individuals, and without any coercion on the part of the state or individuals to participate in activities contrary to such belief.

In recent years, the bishops of the Catholic Church in the United States have sponsored a "Fortnight for Religious Freedom." The purpose of this action is to highlight the concern of the leadership of the Catholic Church regarding what we understand to be fundamental rights in the practice of our faith. The leadership of the Catholic Church has had particular concerns about certain mandates of the Affordable Care Act. In the United States, of particular concern is the recent attitude that has developed that there is a difference between religious faith and religious worship---that we believe and we also act, and that these are not necessarily related.

The Bishops are clear in their teaching that our freedom to believe and live out our faith are both very much a part of our Freedom of Religion, and that governmental agencies need to continue to honor "religious exemption," as has been long-held policy.

It is important to consider religious freedom as a fundamental right, and to further consider exactly what this means in our everyday lives. As Americans, we generally hold to the belief that we are and will always be free to live our lives without governmental interference, especially in areas of religious faith. Fundamental rights, especially those associated with our Constitution are sacrosanct, and must always be respected. As Americans, we don't expect about having our rights violated, especially in our own country.

Consider the plight of the people of Mosul in Iraq. Ten years ago there were over 300,000 Christians living peacefully in this city---one that dates back to ancient times. As recently as two months ago, there were less than 30,000 Christians in this city. In the past two weeks, Islamic fundamentalists; jihadists, really nothing better than "thugs" who operate under the title of "Islamic State of Iraq and Syria" or ISIS, overran this city. They have claimed the city of Mosul for Moslems only and have forced Christians to flee to refugee camps. The Christians have been told to get out, convert to Islam or face death. Homes have been confiscated and Christians have been routinely robbed of their meager possessions as they have been forced to pass through ISIS checkpoints while traveling to safer areas. ISIS rebels have systematically destroyed religious sites, particularly those of Christian perspective. They routinely desecrate statues and painting of Jesus and the Blessed Virgin. Religious buildings are destroyed or changed to serve as Mosques. Even the great Shrine of Jonah, the prophet, sacred to Christians, Jews and Moslems was deliberately blown up. The offices and residence of the Syrian Catholic Archbishop of Mosul was set on fire and leveled!

We who are the Catholic Community of Our Lady of Mount Virgin are called by our baptism to be concerned and supportive of our brothers and sisters whose religious freedoms are under attack, especially in the Middle East and also in Darfur in Sudan. Now is the time for our leaders to act. Religious freedom must be respected, and preserved for all!
