

## A letter from our Pastor

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled.” These are the words that Saint Luke attributes to Saint Elizabeth when she encounters the Blessed Virgin Mary who has rushed to visit her cousin. Elizabeth is much further along in her pregnancy than Mary, so Mary travels to assist her older cousin as she prepares to give birth to a son---a son who will be John the Baptist!

We learn as we consider the “Infancy Narratives” of Saint Luke’s Gospel that Elizabeth’s child, still in the womb, senses the power of God who has enlivened Mary. John “leaps for joy” as he encounters his cousin for the first time----both babies still in the womb, waiting to be born.

Luke invites us to consider today the incredible awe and wonder that the two women must have experienced as they shared with each other the special encounter each had with God’s messenger. Both will give birth to sons who are “destined” for greatness--greatness in sharing God’s goodness in the world. John will announce the Word coming among the people, Jesus will be that very Word, alive and present in the human condition.

Elizabeth’s words to Mary as they first encounter each other in Luke’s Gospel, are an expression of Mary’s trust in God: “Blessed are you who believed.” Luke invites us as we continue our own time of joyful preparation in anticipation of our own encounter with the Lord to also “believe” in the power of God’s message as God speaks to our hearts.

More than anything else, we are invited to consider Mary’s willingness to walk always in the presence of her God. She readily admits that she doesn’t understand everything that God is asking of her, but without hesitation, she readily agrees because she can only say “yes” to God. Mary’s “yes” is also her motivation to go forward and assist her cousin. She is somehow “compelled” as an outgrowth of her belief and trust in God’s messenger. Mary cannot say “yes” and then not act. Mary’s “yes” to serve as the vehicle for the “Divine Son” to enter the world is also a “yes” to become a vehicle of the ongoing expression of the “Divine Word” in the human condition.

As we consider today’s Gospel passage, we are invited to consider our willingness to open our hearts and souls to the Word of God that speaks to each one of us. Just as it was for Mary and also for Elizabeth, so we too are invited to “believe and trust” in God’s Word. And because of Mary’s “yes,” we know that the Word is, indeed, Jesus---our Lord and Savior.

We are asked today as we enter into the final days of our Advent preparation to examine our own willingness to believe: to believe in the presence of God in our daily lives, to believe in the truth of Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior who is ever-present in the world, to believe in the grace of the Blessed Virgin Mary whose “yes” we imitate.

We prepare with great joy and anticipation for the coming of the Lord. We are called to believe in His presence and to trust in his awesome power in our lives!
